Our Mission

SOS promotes housing stability and family self-sufficiency through collaboration, care, and respect.

Together, we have...



Housed 81 families

- 11 families with 20 adults & 42 children stayed at SOS's shelter-homes.
- 78 families with 91 adults & 194 children received rental assistance and case management in the Rapid Rehousing program.
- 77% of families in Rapid Rehousing exited to permanent housing.



Fed 14,391 individuals

- 10,320 request for food fulfilled through SOS's choice food pantry, pre-ordering and walk in services available.
- 271,488 pounds of food were distributed.

Together, we have...



Provided walk-in services to 1,024 people

- 225 households received funds to pay utility bills, totaling \$165,075
- 13,130 diapers distributed
- 1,024 households provided with utility assistance, baby formula or other assistance.
- 1,497 referrals, including 373 referrals for emergency housing



Helped 157 children learn and grow

- 76 families with 157 young children participated in Parents as Teachers, which promotes early childhood learning and health through home visits and groups



Eviction Prevention

- SOS prevented eviction and homelessness for 152 households with Section 8/Housing Choice Vouchers who were at-risk of losing their housing assistance.



COVID Eviction Relief Act (CERA) Program

- SOS distributed \$15,537,095 in COVID Emergency Relief Act funding to pay overdue rent accrued during the pandemic for 2,792 households so they could avoid eviction and homelessness.
