Mom and Baby Homeless After Dad's Death

isa has been through a lot: First, she was homeless. Then she became pregnant unexpectedly. Finally, right before the baby was born, her boyfriend died suddenly leaving her alone.

She and Mark became homeless when their landlord sold the building where they were renting. They bounced from place to place, including some short-term stays in hotelbased shelters.

They were able to stay with her parents for a while. But when Lisa's parents' health deteriorated and they needed nursing home care, the couple once again found themselves homeless. They began **couch surfing** again. Sometimes, they lived in their car.

Lisa then became <u>pregnant</u>. A few weeks before the baby was born, **Mark tragically died** in a car accident. Lisa was devastated.

She and her new baby alternated between sleeping a few nights here and there with friends and family and staying in her car. She was <u>grieving deeply</u> over the sudden death of her boyfriend.

When the baby was six months old, because of support from you and other caring people, Lisa was able to rent a new

apartment through SOS's Rapid Rehousing program. Her caseworker helped her find counseling for grief and loss as she grappled with life after her boyfriend's death.

Lisa's SOS caseworker helped her get a child care subsidy so she could find work and increase her income. She completed **cosmetology school** and rented a space to do hair and makeup. She and her case manager worked together to advertise her services on social media.

After a year, Lisa is able to **pay her lease entirely on her own** because she makes enough money from her cosmetology business. SOS's Rapid Rehousing program helped Lisa and her baby get back on their feet after a rough time. Through the support of donors like you, Lisa was able to get back on her feet and create a stable future for her baby.
