SOS Community Services is a non-profit organization dedicated to preventing and ending family homelessness in Washtenaw County, Michigan.

Since 1970, SOS has pioneered local efforts to end homelessness and help those most in need. We provide services such as food and utility assistance to help families remain stably housed. We also offer housing to families without homes.

Our Mission: Promote housing stability and family self-sufficiency through collaboration, care and respect.

Today SOS serves more than 7,000 people each year and focuses on assisting homeless families with children. SOS helps families find housing, employment, provide support to children, and connects them with basic needs. The agency is located on the eastern side of the county (Ypsilanti)—where there is an increased need for support.



WHAT WE DO

It can be hard for families to keep a roof over their heads. SOS Community Services empowers families to stay housed through:

Housing

Shelter: Provide temporary housing for families up to three months.

Rapid Re-Housing: Provide permanent affordable housing and rental assistance for families approximately 7 to 8 months.



The SOS Resource Center

Food Pantry: open twice a week; provides fresh produce, meat, and canned goods for visitors up to 12 times per year.

Walk-In Services:

- Fresh Veggies Weekly
- Utility Assistance
- Transportation Assistance
- Personal Care Items
- Connection to public benefits through the Department of Health & Human Services
- Housing Resources



Programs for Children & Parents

Parents as Teachers (PAT) Program: provides home visitations for families who have children age 5 or younger and offer the following:

- Parent-Child Play Groups
- Referrals for developmental screenings and connections with community resources

Support for Families in Public Housing

Resident Opportunity for Self-Sufficiency (ROSS) Program: parents get support to increase employment and referrals to community resources such as healthcare, bus fare, Head Start, and job fairs.

HCV Eviction Prevention Program: prevents residents from losing housing choice vouchers (HCV) from the Ann Arbor Housing Commission by helping with grievance procedures, paperwork, and utility assistance.
